Re: *UCLA Law Professor Kenneth Klee to Speak at the Business Law Breakfast on March 20, 2014 at 7:30 a.m. at the UCLA Faculty Center*

The Lowell Milken Institute for Business Law and Policy at UCLA School of Law is pleased to announce that UCLA Law Professor Kenneth M. Klee will speak on “The Saga of Jefferson County’s Successful Journey Through Chapter 9” at the Lowell Milken Institute’s Business Law Breakfast on March 20. Jefferson County, Alabama filed for bankruptcy protection in November 2011 and, at that time, its filing was the largest municipal bankruptcy in U.S. history. Professor Klee represented Jefferson County.

Professor Klee is, of course, one of the lions of the modern bankruptcy bar. In addition to being a tenured professor at UCLA, he is a founding partner of Klee, Tuchin, Bogdanoff & Stern LLP, specializing in corporate reorganization, insolvency and bankruptcy law. As an associate counsel to the U.S. House of Representatives Judiciary Committee, he was one of the principal drafters of the 1978 Bankruptcy Code. He has served as a member of the Advisory Committee on Bankruptcy Rules to the Judicial Conference of the United States as well as a member of the executive committee of the National Bankruptcy Conference. Last fall, he was inducted into the Turnaround, Restructuring and Distressed Investing Industry Hall of Fame.

Professor Klee has been counsel in numerous bankruptcy cases throughout the country including the United States Supreme Court. He has served as an expert witness in more than 50 matters and was appointed as the Examiner in the Tribune Company bankruptcy. In addition to teaching at UCLA, Professor Klee has also taught at Harvard Law School and the University of Southern California.

In light of the City of Detroit’s recent filing for bankruptcy protection, we are excited to be able to feature Professor Klee’s timely discussion of the Jefferson County case.
